



You have the right to receive a “Good Faith Estimate” explaining how much your medical or mental health services will cost

Under the law, medical and mental health care providers need to give clients who do not have or are not using health insurance an estimate of the bill for medical or mental health services.

- You have the right to receive a Good Faith Estimate (GFE) for the total expected cost of medical or mental health services. At Lee Pesky Learning Center, this relates to counseling or evaluation services and includes related costs, like extra materials or consultation with other professionals.
- Make sure your medical or mental health care provider gives you a Good Faith Estimate in writing at least 1 business day before your service. You can also ask us, and any other provider you choose, for a Good Faith Estimate before you schedule a service.
- If you receive a bill that is at least \$400 more than your Good Faith Estimate, you can dispute the bill.
- Make sure to save a copy or picture of your Good Faith Estimate.
